Arts and Humanities Bainbridge 2022 Individual Artist Grant

Applications will be reviewed by a panel of jurors made of three AHB Board members and two local art professionals.

Applications from emerging artists are encouraged.

They will be first reviewed for completeness and eligibility. Jurors can ask applicants to clarify a point (s) if deemed necessary.

Eligible applications will be evaluated based on how well they demonstrate alignment with the evaluation criteria. Each criterion will be assigned a score; the maximal score varies as a function of the weight of the criterion. The scores will be collated and determine the ranking of the applications.

Jurors will first review applications individually, and then meet to discuss their scores as a group. The final ranking will be determined by the panel of jurors.

Judging Criteria

Creativity and originality (score 1→10)

- Jurors will look for works that reveal an original approach to process and subject matter

Emergence of personal vision (score 1→15)

- Jurors will look for works that represent a sense of the artist or work that are individualistic in their presentation, execution or ideas. “Do I come away from the work feeling like I know something about the artist who created it”

Skills and Technique (score 1→5)

- Jury will look for mastery of a particular medium.

Feasibility (score 1→5)

- Does the application demonstrate that the project will be realized within the funding period?

Community benefits (score 1→10)

- Does the application define the community the project hopes to serve, interact and engage with? Does the application clearly outline how this will happen?
